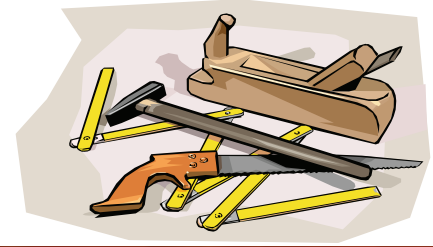

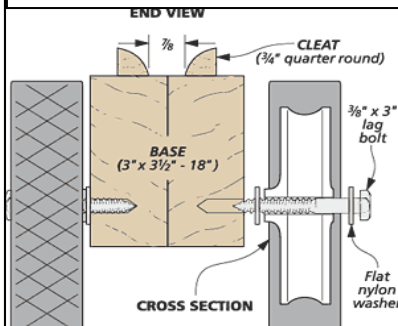
Editors Note

Tip of the Month

This dolly relies on a pair of large-diameter lawnmower wheels to negotiate bumps, cords, and other obstacles. The wheels sandwich a thick support block glued up from scraps of 2x4. A pair of cleats glued to the top of the block keeps the material being moved in place on the dolly. When using the dolly, I try to position it close to the center of the sheet. This gives me the best balance and control.
